In 2018, net income grew to \$2.04 million from \$1.92 million in 2017. Since our inception, CCF has loaned more than \$1.56 billion dollars to our members. Our collections team reduced CCF's already low delinquency rate from 0.70% in 2017 to 0.57% in 2018.

CCF was proud to again be named one of Crain's Detroit 100 Cool Places to Work, as well as one of the Free Press' Top Workplaces in 2018.

We welcomed several new staffers to our teams in 2018, including new managers to strengthen our member service and staff guidance. New employee benefits were also added, like ME Days and student loan repayment assistance to help staff reach optimal work/life balance and assist those with student loans to lower balances.

In September, CCF hosted the 3rd Annual Teddy Bear Drive in support of Childhood Cancer Awareness Month. Over the past 3 years, CCF members and the community have donated more than 3,000 teddy bears to kids with cancer and other serious illnesses. We were happy to

partner with The Children's Hospital of Michigan Foundation to bring smiles, financial help and bear friends to those in need.

CCF's media presence was consistently high in 2018, with dozens of print articles in local papers, as well as expert guest spots throughout the year on local TV stations about the Teddy Bear Drive, housing updates, and money saving tactics.

Our staff banded together to run Troy's Frightful 5K in October with CCF as the main sponsor of the event. More than 25 staffers and families entered the race. We look forward to sponsoring the race again in 2019.

2018 was a year filled with technological advances with the launch of CCF's new Mobile Banking app as well as new Online Banking platform. Members have more digital mobility than ever before, with new features added consistently to keep CCF's digital options on the cutting edge.

We are thankful to our staff, members and board for such a great year in 2018 and we look forward to the continued positive momentum in 2019.
